When you first arrive at our university, there'll be lots of new things and information to take in. *Getting Started* aims to provide a fast-track guide to student life at TH Köln. In addition to your actual program, the university's Library, Department of International Affairs and Academy of Continuing – to name but a few – offer a multitude of opportunities to promote both your professional and your personal development. Whether you're interested in the student association meetings or need advice about something, just pop by – we'll be happy to answer any questions you have.

TH Köln delivers its programs on site and plans to use in-person teaching formats in the winter semester. We hope the Covid situation in the fall will permit normal classes on campus but, obviously, we can't predict how things will actually turn out. Nonetheless, you can rest assured we will make use of all the instruments legislators provide to prevent infections in the winter semester.

27,000

students are currently enrolled at our university. Of these, 64 percent are male and 36 percent female students. In total, TH Köln offers 50 Bachelor's and 50 Master's programs as well as career-integrated models and part-time programs parallel to professional employment.

Our culture

Project-based, interdisciplinary teaching

Your program will start off differently than before the Covid epidemic. Some of your classes and lectures will be online, mainly using three tools (ILIAS, THspaces and Zoom), which are outlined on page 7.

During your time with us, you'll also often come across concepts such as "university-wide interdisciplinary project week", "flipped classroom" or "problem-based learning" – all learning/teaching formats that go beyond the traditional style of lecture.

We use problem-based and project-based learning to develop scenarios that specifically reflect situations in which you'll find yourself in your future career. This often entails working on real projects for companies, institutions and society. Another approach you'll encounter is "inquiry-based learning", in which you'll be involved in professors' research by carrying out projects of various sizes or you'll help develop study materials for future students. It's also quite common for students to collaborate on a project with peers from other programs. So

we give you more freedom than you're used to from school but we also expect you to take on more responsibility for your own learning. There are also tutors and mentors on hand – usually students from later semesters – to support you during the initial stages of your program. The faculty student associations will be happy to help too. You can find out more about them on page 14.

We believe that a feedback culture is an important part of good teaching practice. During your program, you'll get to participate in evaluations by rating your seminars and courses and telling us about your experiences and what changes you'd like to see. There's also a feedback management office that you can contact about anything you want to discuss. For more information, turn to page 11.

Your basic tools at TH Köln

MultiCa, campusID, WiFi and IT

Your Student ID Card: The MultiCa

You have received your MultiCa by mail after your enrollment. This card will play an important role in your everyday life at TH Köln. The multifunctional smart card serves as your student ID card, your public transport pass for the entire Rhine-Sieg Transport Association (VRS) as well as your library and copy card. Additionally, it can be used for (cashless) payments in all university cafeterias, and it gives you access to the university lockers.

What data is saved on the card chip?

Only the serial number of the card, your student ID, a status indicator (in your case, student), the University library number and the period of validity are saved. Only the amount of your credit is saved on the card but no information on what it was used for.

campusID

Your campusID is your personal university account. It is generated automatically for you when you enroll. Your username and the initial password for your first login have been sent to your private e-mail address.

To activate your campusID, please follow the instructions in the e-mail. After activating your account, you can choose an individual password.

Once your campusID has been activated, it will give you access to a broad range of university services, such as your university email account, ILIAS, PSSO or the university Wi-Fi. You will find further information and instructions on: th-koeln.de/campusid (in German)

WiFi

Eduroam, the university Wi-Fi service, does not only give you internet access at TH Köln's sites, but at every campus of an Eduroam university around the world. However, your device must comply with a few specifications. For information on the specifications and on setting up your Eduroam access go to: th-koeln.de/eduroam (in German)

VPN

You can access all services available on the TH Köln university network via a VPN connection, even from home or on the go. To access the university's internal services, you will need to install the Cisco VPN client on your computer, notebook or smartphone. Different versions of the Cisco VPN client are available. Email

Your campusID will give you access to your personal TH Köln email address. TH Köln uses this address to provide you with important information on your studies. That is why it is important that you check your emails regularly. Usually, this email address has the following structure: `firstname.surname@smail.th-koeln.de`

You can reset your campusID password via the campusID website. The *Forgot your password?* function gives you access to your personal account, where you can choose a new password. The *Forgot your campusID?* function will send your campusID username to you.

You will need your CampusID to log into the webmail system. Alternatively, you can access your emails via clients such as Mozilla Thunderbird, Outlook, or Apple Mail. You will find the necessary configuration data and further information on our website.

Hochschulbibliothek (Library)

TH Köln's four interconnected campus libraries provide extensive information services for students. Their wide selection of resources, the browsable online catalog and numerous specialist databases mean you benefit from a varied range of information, specifically tailored to the programs at TH Köln.

PC workstations, scanners and copiers round off the information infrastructure. All digital media, like ebooks and ejournals, can also be accessed from home via a VPN.

The library's YouTube channel has a number of "how to" videos (in German) with guidance and tips on how to use the library's services, VPN access and the borrowing process. If you need additional assistance to find what you're looking for, the service desk staff at your campus library will be glad to help – in person, by phone or by email.

PSSO stands for *Prüfungs- und Studierendenservice Online* (Online Examination and Student Services). PSSO offers students the possibility to easily organize administrative matters such as:

- Updating address and contact details
- Printing certificates of enrollment and BAföG certificates
- Printing transcripts of records and accessing information on examination results
- Registering for or withdrawing from examinations

Exception: It is currently not possible for most exchange students to register for or deregister from examinations using PSSO. Only exchange students at the Faculty for Business, Economics and Law and the Faculty of Architecture can register for examinations using PSSO. All other exchange students will be informed on the terms for examination registration by the International Office or by their faculty.

Password/initial access to PSSO

Once your campusID is activated, you will be able to log on to PSSO. Similar to online banking, you need a TAN for using PSSO. You receive the first TAN list by mail along with your MultiCa. If you would like to request a new password or initial access to PSSO, our Campus IT's service team will be glad to assist you. Please note that such requests must to be filed in person at TH Köln's Campus IT. Please make sure to bring identification documents with you (such as ID or passport). You will immediately receive your new login details.

MultiCa stations
